

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Galena

Our water system violated several drinking water standards over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During January to December 2025, we were required to monitor Total Trihalomethanes and Haloacetic Acids during the month of August, we did not complete all monitoring during the required month and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time. However, samples were collected on 9/15/2025, and all results were satisfactory (edited 11/26/2025).

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do currently.

The table below lists the contaminants we did not properly test for during the this year, how often we are supposed to sample Total Trihalomethanes and Haloacetic Acids, how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.
